The ballrooms are in splendid shape. and the Grand Ballroom still remains the largest room afloat. The Sunday Brunch was held in the Grand Ballroom. and there had to be well over a hundred food choices. They even provided a harpist. playing "Waltzing Matilda". I mentioned afloat above. a Queen is afloat along side a wharf inside a breakwater dam. It is moored are and aft with cables. and is held away from the wharf with pneumatic bumpers.
