LAST WORDS FROM MAX OSBORN

As the duly elected and unqualified leader of the organization I appreciated all the help including HUGH HIMES, the only other member of our group residing in Cheyenne, who kept the bus system working as well as many other things. I promoted him to corporal.

SAM RICHMOND 65th, was one who regretted, due to personal reasons, although he had his cowboy hat packed. PAUL COBER made the reunion and sent his change of address. The new roster will reflect that.

TOMMY MOTE forgot to pick up hid ten year warranty for the life membership he sent in. He was too busy trying to jog my memory of grass landing near Nadzab, while I was trying to remember what I had for lunch the day before.

A post script form our out going leader and a New Jersey yankie (the worst kind).

There were 12,731 built by Boeing and 4750 were lost in the war. I believe there are only a half dozen still flying condition in the United States. Nearly every pilot that has flown the B-17 says "It's a damn good airplane". Here's a story about one in WWII:

A B-17 over the target caught a direct hit in the center of the airplane, causing the airplane to break in two. The wings spiraled down and the tail fluttered like a maple leaf toward the ground. The tail gunner looked around and saw that the rest of the airplane was gone, so he decided to bail out. However, he couldn't get out due to the mangled mess of aluminum blocking him in.

He decided to make the best of a bad situation so he went back and strapped himself into his seat. He reached up overhead and grabbed the cable that controlled the rudder, then reached down along his side and pulled on the cables that operated the elevator. The controls checked out okay, so he turned the tail around and decided to take her back to England. All went well, and as he approached the coast of England he radioed the tower, "Tower this is B-17 tail gunner, the rest of my airplane has been shot away and I would like a clearance to make an emergency landing straight in on runway 27." The tower responded, "Roger, B-17 tail gunner, give me a clll on five mile final." When he was five miles out the gunner again radioed. "Tower, this is B-17 tail gunner, five miles out on final approached, am I clear to land?"

The tower frantically answered, "Negative B-17 tail gunner, do not land, pull up and go around, there is a B-24 in the traffic pattern with an engine shut down."

The passing of our comrade HARRY DANLZIEL, 63rd ordnance.

It was no surprise to hear, from his brother **WALTER**, that **HARRY DANLZIEL** died on September 15, 1995. I had talked to him on September 3rd, and his voice was very, very weak. You will be pleased to know that he had received and enjoyed the card we all signed and the reunion cap I mailed from Cheyenne.

HARRY was a talented artist. He designed all that banners that decorated all uor reunion banquet halls. Each one had a theme approriate to the location of uor meeting. He also prepapred other banners for other events, such as the ones we carried at the ANZAC day parade at Sydney 1987, and the we displayed at Bolings B-17 50th Birthday party in 1985.

All this pride in history by a man who flew no missions, received no medals, but as member of the Ordance Section stuck out the whole damn war loading bombs into our planes.

Our Association was something special to HARRY and he will always be a special person to us. God bless him.

Notes and comments on 43rd Reunion in Wyoming.

Since starting the annual reunion of 43rd Bomb Group veterans in 1981 at San Antonio, my wife, **DORIS** and I have been to (15) fifteen reunions and maybe (5) five more mini-reunions including Seattle in 1985 for 50th Birthday of B-17, Bangor, ME for dedication, Philidalphia, PA and Salem, OR.

Cheyenne was a good time for everyone and MAX OSBORN, and his wife FRAN deserve a lot of the credit for the happy time there. Personally, I never feel that I have enough time at the reunion to see and talk with old and new friends, but I will mention a few impressions of things I learned while I was there. Over 320 registered and joined in the activities- elected a new president, JIM MURPHY, 63rd and BOB WATSON, 65th as vice president. BILL WILLSON, 65th volunteered to stay on as secretary- treasurer, until a new secretary can be found.

DON BANKER, 65th. Our faithful storekeeper and dispenser of 43rd caps and other momentos died on August 18, 1995, after a long battle with prostate cancer. I talked to Don in July and at that time, he was worried but still making plans to come to Cheyenne. Don was from Alvine, Texas, he was a good friend of NOLAN RYAN'S family and sent me a book on the famous no- hitter baseball pitcher, for the Texas Rangers. I don't know any 43rd member, who who enjoyed the reunions more or worked any harder at them. I'm just sad that when I called him about Cheyenne, he had died the week before. His daughter is DONNA BAKER ALEXANDER of 5503 Meadow Lane, Bearland, TX 77584. I sent a small memorial to her, which will be used by the American Legion-Boy State at Alvin, and hope other 43rd members will write to DONNA because her dad was something special in the 43rd.

FATHER THOMAS SHEA, Hq. 43rd and later 5th Bomber Command Chaplain, is now in his nineties and fragile, in a Hartford, Conn. Catholic nursing home. LOU ALPE, Hq. was the key person who located FATHER SHEA in 1981 and when the "COACH" said he would come to San Antonio, I knew that it would be a success and for many years after, he had the Memorial services at the reunions and was a strong financial supporter. LOU ALPE, was at Cheyenne and gave a report on "COACH" SHEA and his poor condition, so I hope you will remember him in your prayers.

SON TEMS OF INTEREST

PHIL HOFFECKER and ED "LUCKY" STEVENS were good friends in the 64th sqd. overseas. PHIL and "LUCKY" came to several reunions together, but "LUCKY" died in NJ, in 1981, after 50 years with Hewlett-Packard. PHIL retired after many years as Chauffeur for the DUPONT family in Wilmington, Del. I was very happy to see PHIL at Cheyenne. He is 83 YEARS OLD, looks like 60 and drove, ALONE all the way to Cheyenne, Wy., from Kennett Square, PA.

"LUCKY" and PHIL were both veterans of the Queen Mary voyage and "LUCKY" probably had more missions than anyone else in the 5th A.F. in the 64th and other units. He married an Australian lady, but didn't live to use the free trip for two in celebration of his long service to his company.

One last item, which interested me greatly.

At Cheyenne, in conversation with JEAN JACK, 403rd. I learned that COL. JACK, then 1st Lt., was on the same mission to Rabaul, when Brig. Gen. KENNETH WALKER turned up missing in action, after bombing Rabaul. JEAN JACK also got shot up on this mission, and had to ditch near the Trobriand Islands, some distance from Rabaul. I was working in 63rd operations at this time and remember the scores of search planes sent out to find GEN. WALKER: evena 4 engine British flying boat, a Sunderland. COL. JACK got his crew ashore and DALE BARR, one of his gunnies was negotiating with the natices in pidgin English. In comes the search planes, thinking they had found the missing GEN. WALKER, they were disappointed in just finding a missing crew, that some were doubtful they would be rescued. A young Lt., reporting to COL. ROGER RAMEY, 43rd Gp. Commander, when asked about WALKER, said to RAMEY "No, it was not WALKER, but just a Lts. crew. Where upon the Lt was chewed out by RAMEY, because JACK was trusted and a valuable member of the 403rd.

I checked this out in the history <u>FLYING BUCCANEERS</u> "Story of **KENNEY'S** Fifth AF" by Australian writer **STEVE BIRDSALL-**-Page 45, quoted verbatim.

WALKER had altered the take off time of the mission during the morning of January 5 ('43) and gone to Rabaul himself, both against KENNEY'S orders. Crews from other planes reported seeing the Fortress about twenty-five miles from the target, losing height, one engine afire, and under fighter attack. KENNEY sent every available recon plane out to search for survivors, and in the eventing a B-17 was reported on coral reef in the Trobriand Islands. A retrieved KENNEY decided to reprimand WALKER, severely and sent him on leave to Australia. MCARTHUR said "Alright, George, but if he doesn't come back I'm going to send his name in to Washington reccommending him for a Congressional Medal of Honor."

A Catalina picked up the stranded B-17 crew (JACK'S crew), but it was not WALKER. He was awarded the Medal of Honor.

SIDE NOTE

Wonder why no one mentioned JEAN JACK and his crew? JACK later became C.O. of the 403rd at one time, temporary co. of the 43rd Gp. Post war he had a distinguished career with the Atomic Energy Com. and as a college professor in Tenn.

MAX and FRAN OSBORN, our President and Host, did a super job on the reunion, Great Program. We all thank you for knocking yourself out of us--We are recommending "Max for PFC"--Very good attendance--325,
