Received a phone call the other night from a MARY MC GINNIS calling from Sydney, Australia. She would like any information about the following American airmen who were over in that area during WW2. The information is a little sketchy.

These fellows were either in B-17s, B-24s or both. ERIC "JOE" MC CORMICK, radio operator from San Francisco, JACK HOWARD from Los Vegas, and last, JOE BUCKWALTER. The time frame was 43-44.


